Collinsville High School will offer a Summer School Program during the summer of 2010. Classes will be held at the high school beginning on June 1 and continuing through June 30, Monday through Friday. 1st session will be held from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. 2nd session will be held from 11:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. The courses to be offered in the 2010 Summer School Program are as follows:

Please Note: Seats in classes are assigned for complete registrations only. Registration is complete when registration form and payment has been made. All registration will be confirmed and are on a first come, first serve basis. Classes will not be held unless a minimum of 16 students enroll.

To register for summer school: Review the Summer School Program Attendance Policies and Rules, Complete the Registration Form, and bring it with your payment to the Guidance Office at CHS. Office hours are 7:15-3:45 p.m. The deadline to register is May 21, 2010. Students who have questions should see their counselor.

In addition to the above, Driver Education classes are available and are arranged by Mr. Hollingshead.

A student may take any of the courses, except the math courses, for enrichment, or as makeup for failures. A minimum of 16 students must be enrolled in order for a class to be conducted. Students are responsible for providing their own transportation to the Summer School Program.

Lunch will not be provided during summer school; you may bring your lunch and eat at school. Also, you may leave campus between sessions for lunch, but the tardy policy applies if the student returns late from lunch. A soda machine will be provided during summer school.

All students taking summer school classes will receive credit for that course. Students auditing a summer academic class must have prior written approval from administration before summer school class begins.

The last day to drop a class and not receive a grade of WF is June 1. No schedule changes are permitted.

Finals exams will be taken on the designated day. No final can be taken early or late, no exceptions

Instructional fees for the 2010 Summer School programs are 100.00 (per 1/2 credit session)

THERE ARE NO REFUNDS OF FEES IN THE SUMMER SCHOOL PROGRAM

There is a tuition fee of \$50.00 for out-of-district students. The tuition fee is applicable regardless of the number of credits for which an out-of-district student registers. The tuition fee is in addition to the appropriate instructional fee. Only students residing in the Collinsville Unit #10 School District are eligible for Driver Education during the summer. A Driver Education Behind-the-Wheel fee of \$50.00 will be charged.

Attendance is essential during the Summer School Program since it is a concentrated program of 66 class hours. A student who misses more than two (2) days during a session is automatically dropped from summer school unless there are unusual circumstances requiring non-attendance. Two tardies to class count as one absence.

Important Dates and Times

June 1 through June 30

Summer School Session 1 begins at 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Session 2 begins at 11:30 a. m. to 2:30 p.m. including a 10 minute break each session

Attendance Policies

Attendance is essential during the Summer School Program these are concentrated programs of 66 class hours per session. Students are allowed two absences during a session in Summer School. A student will be dropped from class on the third absence of the session. No partial absences are allowed. Attempts may be made to contact the parent on the second absence. This could be done as a courtesy to explain the resulting drop in the event of a third absence. Students will not be excused from summer school for vacation.

Tardiness is defined as reporting up to 5 minutes late at the beginning of class or returning late from break. Reporting to class or returning from break in excess (over) 5 minutes late is considered an absence. In addition, two tardies to class is considered one absence.

No early dismissals will be allowed. If a student needs to leave for any reason, then they will receive an absence.

Finals exams will be taken on a designated day no final can be taken early or late, no exceptions

No student is allowed to go to his or her car or to the parking lot. If a student does they will be dropped from the program with no refunds.

Rules and Regulations

Any disciplinary referrals could result in dismissal from the Summer School Program.

Smoking is prohibited on campus. Any student caught smoking will be dropped from the program.

Students are to dress appropriately for classroom sessions - specifically, no caps, tank tops, tube tops, bare-midriff and see-through clothing. Clothing with vulgar, profane, or suggestive messages or pictures of illegal substances, alcoholic beverages, or tobacco products is not allowed.

Students are not to use lockers during Summer School.

Cell phones may be used during break or in between classes. Phone usage during class time or any disruption of summer school with a cell phone will result in the following; first offence - teacher will confiscate phone, second offence – parent will have to come into the office to retrieve the phone, third offence – the student will be dropped from summer school.

A soda machine will be available to purchase soda at the break or between sessions. The availability of the soda machine depends on its proper usage. Lunch will not be provided during summer school; you may bring your lunch and eat at school. Also, you may leave campus between sessions for lunch, but the tardy policy applies if the student returns late from lunch.

Fighting on campus will result in the involved students being dropped from the program.

Some sections of the building will be closed to students during the summer. These sections of the building will not be used for Summer School and are being cleaned and prepared for the opening of school in the fall. Students who are in these sections without proper authorization will be dropped from the program. This includes the parking lot.
